THE LAROSE FOREST was created in 1928, when agronomist Ferdinand Larose undertook the first conifer plantation on what was previously abandoned land.

Since the year 2000, the Larose Forest is managed by the regional municipality of the United Counties of Prescott and Russell (UCPR).
